- Invite education staff to plan intentional interactions that meet all individual children's interests—including children who are dual language learners and children with disabilities, suspected delays, or other special needs.
- Remind education staff to make sure the learning experiences promote the knowledge, skills, and concepts described in the curriculum. Make sure they understand how these are related to ELOF goals.
